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## SUCCESS STORY:

(From this issue onwards we would like to give you a small write up on the success stories from our existing project, and from the efforts of Fr John Suresh and Akka Nandhini Krishnan – Editorial team)



Dear friends I am Ambrose hailing from the village namely **Thatchoor** (The village which was under slavery for nearly two hundred years because of caste system) and a member of WE group, happy to share my success story with you. In our village the **Dalit (socially untouchables)** children cannot hope for higher studies. Even if we wish to study, the high caste people will not allow us or they will threaten our parents not to send for higher studies. The reason for that is the higher caste people cannot bear if the Dalit children are becoming educated. They always want to keep us as their slaves. That is why most of our elders would not have stepped into even schools. This situation was until Fr. Suresh's arrival to our village. After his coming as priest in charge of Thatchoor Parish everything got changing especially free from slavery. All the children started to complete their schools and doing higher studies in the colleges. I am one among those students who was sent to higher studies by Fr. Suresh in our village. He helped me to study B.Ed ( Bachelor of Education) after my under graduation in English literature. I completed my course successfully but the newly formed government passed a law one year ago that those who have completed teachers study should pass TET exam also (Teachers Eligibility Test) conducted by the government to get government jobs in government schools with Government Salary. Otherwise we are not eligible to get job even if we have the qualification. Fr. Suresh and Nandhini Akka encouraged and helped me a lot to get pass in the qualification exam. By following their guide lines I appeared for the exam passed the examination successfully. More than six lakhs teachers wrote the exam and only a few hundred teachers only passed the exam and I am one among those few passed. In our village teachers from the high caste also wrote the exam but they could not pass but I could do it with the help of Fr. Suresh and Nandhini Akka. From now onwards after six months I will be appointed in the government job in a government school with in our district. Now I sincerely thank and dedicate my success to all the donors and especially to Rev. Fr. Suresh and Nandhini akka who are driving force for my success.
